CAPE POINT VINEYARDS ISLIEDH 400

(islied h - pronounced i-lay)

Area : Noordhoek

Named after the owner's granddaughter, Isliedh best reflects the uniqueness of the Noordhoek Estate: Here a special block of severely windswept vines yield tiny crops of concentrated and well structured Sauvignon Blanc. To add texture, the wine is blended with Semillon, barrel fermented in 50% new and 50% 2nd fill French Oak, and then aged on lees for 10 months. Fantastic mineral tension backed by flavours of tropical fruit, limes, spice and subtle oak, which follow onto a full palate with great length.

Perfume, spice, tea, stone fruit and citrus blossoms are some of the notes that can be detected. In the mouth the texture and ripeness and gentle tannins result in a wine that has incredible length and complex flavour profile. The wine also has wonderful fruit volume characterised by stone fruit and mineral flavours. Wonderfully fresh, tangy and textured - guaranteed to bring a smile to your face!

The high Cabernet Franc component adds a fine, glossy texture and seamless length. This is an exceptional wine that you need to drink at least once in your life to tell your friends about. It's like joining Ernie on the last hole at Augusta on the final day...

Still very young but brooding, promising further maturation potential. The palate is full bodied, structured but packed with fresh dark fruit and rounded, linear tannins.

Sweet vanilla and dark chocolate aromas reveal the spicy French oak contribution. Each individual cultivar adds to complexity creating a harmonious blend of pure enjoyment. The elegance and finesse of the Merlot uplifts the cedar, cigar box undertone of the Cabernet Sauvignon while the Petit Verdot adds colour and tightens the tannins. The perfumed fruit is enhanced by the gentle fragrance of the Cabernet Franc. The Tiara expresses the perfect marriage of the four varieties into one harmonious blend.

All the wines were made separately and matured in new French oak barrels for 23 months before being blended about a month before bottling. The result is a wine with a deep, saturated ruby colour and intriguing fragrance of violets and thyme, intense black current and underlying savoury depth of cigar-box, cedar and black truffle; superbly crafted with good balance of vibrant multi-layered fruit supported by tight, well-honed tannins, handles the oak effortlessly; opulent yet sophisticated with a long, compelling finish. The palate is seductive, richly flavorful and smooth combining generosity and subtlety, fullness and vigor, followed by a delicately fresh crispness, to reveal the magical balance of Champagne.

Méthode Cap Classique

“Champagne” is known as Méthode Cap Classique in South Africa. South Africa cannot use the name Champagne as this is derived from the region of France where the original “Bubblys” came from. A classic Méthode Cap Classique has a nose that will remind you of delicious shortcake biscuity flavours with hints of fruitiness and a dry finish. You’ll start inventing celebrations just so you can open a bottle of South Africa’s Méthode Cap Classique. Méthode Cap Classique may be made from one or more of three grape varieties - Chardonnay, Pinot Noir and Pinot Meunier. Wines made from these grape varieties are subjected to the so-called méthode champenoise – essentially involving a second fermentation inside the bottle in which they are sold. Champagne can be drunk at any time of the day – there’s always an excuse for a celebration!

Entheos is the root word of Enthusiasm. This wine celebrates excitement, joy and energy.

Sparkling Wine

The Charmat Methode go for its second, bubble-forming fermentation in a tank and is bottled under pressure. Carbonated sparklers are made by the injection of carbon dioxide bubbles (as in fizzy soft drinks). Sweetness levels range between Brut (extra Dry), Sec (Dry), Demi-Sec (semi-sweet) to Doux (sweet).

Nose: cut grass, green asparagus, green pepper, gooseberry and granadilla. The aroma usually follows through to the palate. Zesty and refreshing. 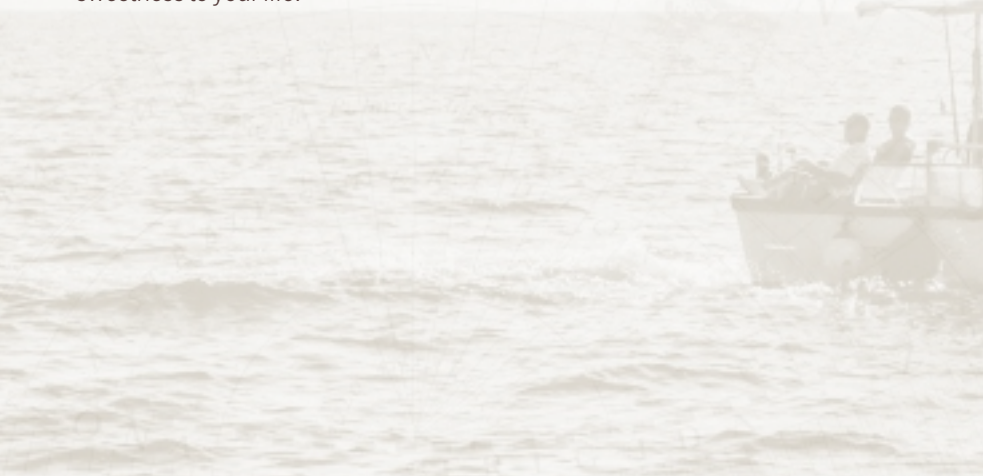

Out of all the world's wine-producing nations, South Africa is unique in knowing the exact date on which its wine industry began, thanks to the entry on 2 February 1659 in the diary of Jan van Riebeeck, official of the Dutch East India Company and First Commander of the Cape: "Today, praise be to God, wine was made for the first time from Cape grapes." In one sense, then, the South African wine industry is very well established. In another, it could be said that it dates no further back than some 20 years, 11 February 1990 being the date that Nelson Mandela walked free from Victor Verster Prison in Paarl, a watershed moment in the political and social transformation of the country. There are about 60 appellations within the Wine of Origin (WO) system, which was implemented in 1973 with a hierarchy of designated production regions, districts and wards. WO wines must be made 100% from grapes from the designated area. As far as international wine production is concerned, France leads with 17.3% of the total, Italy is second with 17.2%, Spain third with 13.0% and South Africa seventh with 3.5% (2010 figures). According to the latest available data (2011 provisional), South Africa is the eighth largest wine producer in the world, producing 9.665 million hectolitres a year, putting it behind Chile in seventh place with 10.463 million hectolitres and ahead of Germany in ninth place with 9.611 million hectolitres (France and Italy vie year on year for biggest global producer overall). The Cape winelands are some of the most breathtakingly beautiful in the world. Several of the wine routes, including Constantia, Durbanville, Darling, Stellenbosch, Helderberg, Paarl, Franschhoek, Wellington and Walker Bay, are within an hour or less easy driving distance from Cape Town. Others, like Breedekloof, Worcester, Robertson, the Little Karoo, Tulbagh, the Swartland, Olifants River and the Northern Cape take you on a slightly longer journey through constantly changing and spectacular landscapes. Undeniably, South African wine has a higher alcohol content than French wine. Typical alcohol levels in French wine range from 10%-12% for white and 11-13% for red. South African wine starts at 12% and goes up to 16% for both red and white wine, averaging at around 14% for both. One has to keep in mind that the alcohol in wine results from the fermentation of sugar. The more sugar there is in the original grape juice, the higher the alcohol in the wine. The sugar in grapes increases dramatically as they ripen. In the cool climate of Europe, the grapes never reach the levels of ripeness that they do in the hot South African summer, so there is less sugar in the juice. In brief, hot summers produce riper grapes, which have more sugar, which essentially produces a higher level of alcohol. Van alle wijnproducerende landen op de wereld is Zuid Afrika uniek vanwege het feit dat precies bekend is wanneer de wijnindustrie in het land begon. Dit dankzij het dagboek van Jan van Riebeeck, officier van de Verenigde Oost-Indische Compagnie en eerste bevelhebber van de Kaap, dat op 2 februari 1659 begint met de zin "Vandaag, prijs de Heer, is voor het eerst wijn gemaakt van Kaapse druiven". Aan de ene kant heeft Zuid Afrika op wijngebied een lange geschiedenis. Aan de andere kant gaat de Zuid Afrikaanse wijngeschiedenis eigenlijk niet verder terug dan ongeveer 20 jaar, namelijk vanaf 11 februari 1990, de datum waarop Nelson Mandela als vrij man de Victor Verster gevangenis in Paarl verliet, en het land een ware transformatie op zowel politiek als sociaal gebied onderging. Er bestaan ongeveer 60 geregistreerde wijnen binnen het WO systeem (Oorsprong van de Wijn), dat in 1973 is geïntroduceerd. Elke wijnregistratie geeft aan in welke regio, district en huis de wijn gemaakt is. WO wijnen moeten voor 100% gemaakt zijn van druiven uit het opgegeven gebied. Voor wat betreft de internationale wijnproductie gaat Frankrijk aan kop met een productie aandeel van 17,3%, Italië is tweede met 17,2%, Spanje derde met 13% en Zuid Afrika bekleedt een zevende plaats met 3,5% (dit zijn cijfers uit 2010). De laatste beschikbare cijfers zijn uit 2011 en daaruit blijkt Zuid Afrika het achtste wijnproducerende land van de wereld te zijn. Het produceert 9.665 miljoen hectoliter wijn per jaar, achter Chili op een zevende plaats met 10.463 miljoen hectoliter en voor Duitsland op een negende plaats met 9.611 miljoen hectoliter (Frankrijk en Italië zijn jaar na jaar 's werelds grootste producenten). Het Kaapse wijnheuvengebied is een van de mooiste en meest adembenemende van de wereld. Diverse wijnroutes, zoals Constantia, Durbanville, Darling, Stellenbosch, Helderberg, Paarl, Franschhoek, Wellington and Walker Bay, liggen op een afstand van minder dan een uur rijden van Kaapstad. De route door wijnstreken, zoals Breedekloof, Worcester, Robertson, the Little Karoo, Tulbagh, the Swartland, Olifants River en de Noordkaap vergt iets meer reistijd, maar leidt u door een zeer afwisselend en prachtig landschap. Onmiskenbaar is dat Zuid Afrikaanse wijnen een hoger alcoholpercentage hebben dan Franse wijnen. Franse alcoholpercentages variëren tussen 10-12% in witte wijn en tussen 11-13% in rode wijn. Zuid Afrikaanse wijnen echter starten met een percentage van 12% en variëren tot 16% in zowel rode als witte wijn. Het gemiddelde percentage is 14%. U moet weten dat het alcoholpercentage in wijn het resultaat is van de fermentatie van suiker. Hoe meer suiker in het druivensap, hoe hoger het alcoholpercentage in de wijn. Het suikergehalte in druiven neemt ontzettend toe tijdens het rijpingsproces. In het koelere Europese klimaat kan een druif nooit de rijpheid bereiken, die een druif gedurende de hete Zuid Afrikaanse zomers bereikt. Als gevolg hiervan heeft een Europese druif een lager suikergehalte. In het kort komt het erop neer dat hete zomers zorgen voor rijpere druiven met meer suiker die uiteindelijk zorgen voor het hogere alcoholpercentage. Aus der ganzen Welt der weinproduzierenden Nationen ist Südafrika das einzige Land, das eindeutig das genaue Datum weiß, an dem seine Weinindustrie begann. Dank der Eintragung am 2. Februar 1659 im Tagebuch von Jan van Riebeeck, Beamter der Niederländischen Ostindien-Kompagnie und erster Kommandeur des Kaps: "Heute, gelobet sei Gott, wurde Wein zum ersten Mal aus Kapträumen gemacht." Einerseits ist die südafrikanische Weinindustrie sehr gut aufgebaut. Andererseits kann man sagen, dass sie auch erst 20 Jahre alt ist, mit dem 11. Februar 1990, der Tag an dem Nelson Mandela aus dem Victor Verster Gefängnis in Paarl frei gelassen wurde, ein Wendepunkt in der politischen und sozialen Transformation des Landes. Es gibt etwa 60 Bezeichnungen innerhalb des Weinsprungs-Systems (WO), die seit 1973 mit einer Hierarchie der bezeichneten Produktion, Regionen, Bezirke und Stadtbezirke ausgewiesen werden müssen. WO Weine müssen 100 % aus Trauben der angegebenen Region erfolgen. Was internationale Weinproduktion angeht, führt Frankreich mit 17,3 % der Gesamtsumme, Italien ist mit 17,2 % Zweiter, Spanien Dritter mit 13,0 % und Südafrika Siebter mit 3,5 % (Zahlen 2010). Nach den neuesten verfügbaren Daten (2011) ist Südafrika der achtgrößte Weinproduzent der Welt. Es werden 9,665 Millionen Hektoliter pro Jahr produziert, kurz hinter Chile, das als Siebter 10,463 Millionen Hektoliter produziert und vor Deutschland auf Platz neun mit 9,611 Millionen Hektoliter. (Frankreich und Italien konkurrieren Jahr für Jahr um die größte globale Herstellung insgesamt). Das Kapweinland ist eins der schönsten und atemberaubendsten Gegenden der Welt. Einige der Weinstraßen, einschließlich Constantia, Durbanville, Darling, Stellenbosch, Helderberg, Paarl, Franschhoek, Wellington und Walker Bay, sind innerhalb einer Stunde oder weniger Fahrtzeit von Kapstadt aus zu erreichen. Andere Weingegenden, wie Breedekloof, Worcester, Robertson, die kleine Karoo, Tulbagh, das Swartland, Olifants River und das Nordkap führt sie durch ständig wechselnde und spektakuläre Landschaften etwas weiter weg von Kapstadt. Zweifellos hat der südafrikanische Wein einen höheren Alkoholgehalt als die französischen Weine. Der klassische Alkoholgehalt des französischen Weins reicht beim Weißwein von 10 % - 12 % und 11-13 % beim Rotwein. Südafrikanischer Wein beginnt bei 12 % und geht bis zu 16 % für Rot und Weisswein, durchschnittlich bei rund 14 % für beide Weine. Man muß berücksichtigen, dass der Alkohol im Wein aus der Vergärung von Zucker entsteht. Je mehr Zucker im Traubensaft, desto höher ist der Alkohol im Wein. Der Zucker in den Trauben erhöht sich deutlich beim Reifen. Im kühleren Klima Europas erreichen die Trauben nie das Niveau der Reife, welches sie im heißen südafrikanischen Sommer bekommen und es daher weniger Zucker im Saft gibt. Kurz gesagt, heißere Sommer produzieren reifere Trauben mit mehr Zucker, die im wesentlichen einen höheren Alkoholgehalt haben. Pinotage

Pinotage was bred by the late Professor A.I. Perold in 1924 by crossing Pinot Noir and Cinsaut, then locally known as Hermitage. Abraham Izak Perold (20 October 1880 - 11 December 1941) was a remarkable man. He obtained his Ph.D. in Chemistry (summa cum laude) in Germany during 1904 and was first appointed as a temporary professor in Chemistry at the University of Cape Town. The Cape Government sent him on an extended overseas tour to collect grape varieties that could be established locally. Perold is credited with the introduction of Barlinka, which he came across during a visit to Algeria. This variety became the backbone of South Africa's table grape production, earning millions in foreign exchange. Today Pinotage is South Africa's signature red grape. Rich in texture, full bodied and firm in structure with delicate dark berry fruitiness overlain with smokey, tarry and spicy complexity that is often shocking to the uninitiated. Some of these flavours appear in many South African reds but Pinotage is the most expressive.
